



Impact strikes nickel, copper

Impact Minerals has made another promising find at its Red Hill site, with new drilling returning impressive nickel-copper results.

A massive 1.2 metre-thick unit of copper and nickel sulphides were discovered in a 4-metre zone around 60 metres below the former Red Hill Mine site.

It is the second notable find in the area, with previous shallower drilling nearby also producing good results.

The latest sample was assessed using a hand-held X-ray flu-

orescence (XFR) instrument, and showed grades of copper between 1-5 per cent, and nickel grades between 2 and 8 per cent.

The instrument also highlighted the presence of minor metals that could be indicative of valuable platinum-group metals such as ruthenium, rhodium, palladium, osmium, iridium and platinum itself.

Further holes are set to be drilled west of the site, and three holes have also been completed in the area's north, with full results expected in around three weeks.
